### B. John 14:27

- 1. What makes you different? What characteristic should you have more than anything else as a true follower of God? What separates you from this world? Answer: Peace!
- 2. If Jesus gave us His Peace, then why are so many people doing everything within their power to find it? The world can't fill the void, it can't give you peace...money can't give it to you, marriage, family, good job...all of these things should be products of the one thing you should already have...but most people seek through those things to try to find the very thing that continually escapes them. Since Jesus gave it, Just Receive It!

#### II. The God Kind of Peace

### A. Judges 6:22-24

- 1. Jehovah-Shalom: The Bible speaks about peace through this Hebrew word "Shalom" – it is common throughout the Bible as a greeting and a farewell, but it wasn't just meant as a kind word to wish the best for someone. The name Jehovah-Shalom means "The Lord is My Peace". The word peace actually encompasses a greater meaning: Completeness, soundness, and total well-being).(Learn how to have Peace With God & Peace With Yourself).
- 2. Isaiah 9:6 "...Prince of Peace."
- C. Philippians 4:6-7 (There is no worldly explanation of this kind of peace; it is not natural and is therefore impossible to obtain through natural means. The best understanding of how to receive it is to walk like David did... Psalm 23:1-4).
